The safest home is one without a gun. You have significantly reduced the risk of someone getting shot. Still, there are important things you might want to consider to make sure you and those that you care about are as safe as can be:

- Most gun deaths are suicides. Men aged 45 or over are at the highest risk of gun suicide. Do you have someone in your life, maybe a friend or relative, who may have recently lost his job, or who is struggling with substance abuse, or has experienced some form of post-traumatic stress? It is definitely in their best interest to make sure they do not have access to a gun.
